AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF THE MONROE COUNTY EMERGENCY MEDICAL AUTHORITY

1. Pursuant to the provisions of MCL 124.602(2), the Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority was created by the adoption of Articles of Incorporation by the legislative body of each incorporating municipality.
2. The Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority's Articles of Incorporation were published in the Monroe Evening News on October 25, 1989, as evidenced by an Affidavit of Publication.
3. The Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority's Articles of incorporation were duly filed with the Secretary of State of Michigan, Office of the Great Seal of the State of Michigan on November 8, 1989.
4. Pursuant to the provisions of MCL 124.602(3) and Article XV of its Articles of Incorporation, the Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority became effective January 7, 1990.
5. Pursuant to the provisions of MCL 124.603(2), an amendment to the Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority's Articles of Incorporation was adopted by resolution of the legislative body of each city, village and township of which the authority was composed, effective December 15, 1998.
6. The amendment adopted by the resolution of each city, village and township of which the authority was composed, is stated as follows:

"The undersigned incorporating municipality of the Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority hereby consents and agrees to an amendment to Article III, of the Articles of Incorporation heretofore adopted for the Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority, in a nature of adding the City of Monroe as an incorporating municipality."
7. Article III of the Articles of Incorporation of the Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority was therefore amended effective March 1, 2012, and states, as follows:

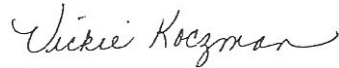

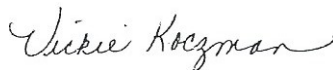

AMENDED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

ARTICLE I

The name of the Authority shall be the Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority.

ARTICLE II

The purpose of said Authority shall be to establish and coordinate emergency medical ambulance services within all cities, villages and townships within the County of Monroe under Act 57 of 1988 MCLS 124.601 and et al.

ARTICLE III

The following units of government are the incorporating municipalities:

- A. County of Monroe
- B. Ash Township
- C. Bedford Township
- D. Berlin Charter Township
- E. Dundee Township
- F. Erie Township
- G. Exeter Township
- H. Frenchtown Charter Township
- I. Ida Township
- J. LaSalle Township
- K. London Township
- L. Milan Township
- M. Monroe Charter Township
- N. Raisinville Township
- O. Summerfield Township
- P. Whiteford Township
- Q. City of Luna Pier
- R. City of Petersburg
- S. Village of Carleton
- T. Village of Dundee
- U. Village of Estral Beach
- V. Village of Maybee
- W. Village of South Rockwood

ARTICLE IV

The Authority is charged with the responsibility of determining and coordinating the needs of the units of government for emergency medical ambulance services, the method or methods of financing a County-wide operation to meet the requirement for caring for injured, sick and persons in need of emergency transportation to the closest, most appropriate medical facility, the responsibility of medical facilities to

support good systems and the obligations of industry and others to meet the needs in the community.

ARTICLE V

MEMBERSHIP

The Authority shall be made up of nine (9) members to be selected by the County Board of Commissioners to be representative of Industry, Labor, Healthcare and Citizens-at-Large. The members shall be appointed for two-year terms. The officers of the Authority shall be Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. Elected officials shall not be eligible for membership.

ARTICLE VI

BODY CORPORATE

The Authority shall be a body corporate. The Authority may acquire private property by purchase, lease, gift, devise or condemnation, either within or without its corporate limits and may hold, manage, control, sell, exchange or lease property.

ARTICLE VII

CONTRACTS

The Authority may enter into a contract with any incorporating municipality for the provision of emergency services in the incorporating municipality for a period not exceeding thirty (30) years. The emergency services may be established or funded in conjunction with any municipal emergency services and any municipal emergency service may be delegated by contract to an authority. The charges specified in a contract shall be subject to increase by the authority, if necessary, in order to provide funds to meet its obligations. The authority may also enter into contracts with a city, village or township that is not an incorporating municipality, for a period not exceeding thirty (30) years except that the charges for services under a contract with a non-incorporating municipality may be greater than the charges to an incorporating municipality and shall be subject to change from time to time without notice. However, existing contracts between the county sheriff' department and the municipalities shall remain in effect for the lifetime of those contracts.

ARTICLE VIII

The Authority, in addition to its other powers and duties, may do all of the following:

- A. Adopt by-laws and rules of administration to accomplish the purposes of this act.
- B. Apply for and accept grants, loans or contributions from the federal government or any of its agencies, the state, or other public or private agencies to be used for any of the purposes of this act and to do any and all things within its express or implied powers necessary or desirable to secure that financial or other aid or cooperation in the carrying out of any of the purposes of this act.
- C. Enter into any contracts with other entities not prohibited by law.
- D. Investigate emergency services requirements, needs and programs and engage, by contract, consultants, as may be necessary and cooperate with the federal government, state, political subdivisions and other authorities in those investigations.
- E. Hire employees, attorneys, accountants and consultants as the Authority considers necessary to carry out the purposes of the authority.

ARTICLE IX

WITHDRAWAL

An incorporating municipality may withdraw from the Authority by resolution of the legislative body in accordance with the statute.

ARTICLE X

FUNDING

- A. The Authority may levy a tax on all taxable property within the limits of the Authority for the purpose of this act.
- B. The tax authorized under Section A shall not be levied without the approval of a majority of the registered voters residing in the Authority affected and qualified to vote. Said election will be conductive in accordance with Section 12(2) of PA 57.

ARTICLE XI

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ADVISORY BOARD

A Local Government Advisory Board shall be created to serve the Authority in an advisory capacity. Said Advisory Board shall consist of one representative appointed by each incorporating municipality located within the County of Monroe.

ARTICLE XII

MEETINGS

The Authority shall meet with the Advisory Board at the call of the Chair of the Authority.

ARTICLE XIII

OPEN MEETINGS ACT

Business of the Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority shall be conducted at a public meeting of the Authority held in compliance with the Open Meetings Act, Act No. 267 of the Public Acts of 1976, as amended, being sections 15.261 and 15.275 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

ARTICLE XIV

AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Amendments to the foregoing Articles of Incorporation may be made if adopted by the legislative body of each city, village or township of which the Authority is composed.

ARTICLE XV

EFFECTIVE DATE OF AUTHORITY

The Authority shall become effective sixty (60) days after the date on which certified copies of these Articles of Incorporation are filed with the Michigan Secretary of State. The Secretary of the Authority shall be charged with the responsibility of causing these Articles of Incorporation to be published and filed pursuant to statute.

**AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

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5. Pursuant to the provisions of MCL 124.603(2), an amendment to the Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority's Articles of incorporation was adopted by resolution of the legislative body of each city, village and township of which the authority was composed, effective December 15, 1998.

6. The amendment adopted by the resolution of each city, village and township of which the authority was composed, is stated as follows:

"The undersigned incorporating municipality of the Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority hereby consents and agrees to an amendment to Article V, entitled **Membership** of the Articles of Incorporation heretofore adopted for the Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority, in the nature of eliminating the restriction that no member appointed thereto may serve more than two consecutive terms and further reducing the number of Emergency Medical Authority Board Members from eleven (11) to nine (9)."

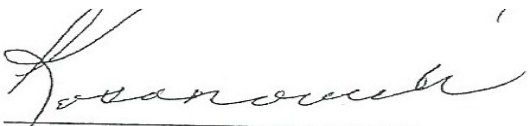
7. Article V of the Articles of Incorporation of the Monroe County Emergency Medical Authority was therefore amended effective December 15, 1998, and states, as follows:
