XII. CENTRAL DISPATCH REPORT — Director Donna Kuti updated members:

- Staffing:
 - 4 Dispatch Trainees in various stages of training.
 - Two in final testing phases waiting for a start date (pending available trainers).
 - Two remaining spots are in the background phase.
- Call Statistics
 - Administration Calls for 2024 were 89,951. Which is a 4.3% decrease from last year (4,069 calls).
 - 911 Calls for 2024 were 64,888. Which is a 14.3% decrease from last year (10,841 calls).
 - Texts to 911 for 2024 were 757. This is 77% higher than last year (427 texts)
 - In 2024, there were 21,811 calls that were responded to by all Fire Departments.
- Metro Life flight has had all their aircraft updated with the Monroe County channels.

- Medical Protocol 26-A-1 is a sick person with no priority symptoms listed. This was updated to an EMS Only Response. The purpose of this change was to eliminate a fire response on calls for service such as blood pressure checks.
- MEVO: Our back up 911 call processing equipment was updated and additional phones were added to dispatch. The phones allow us to transfer both 911 phone lines and non-emergency phone lines to these phones if there is an issue with our CPE equipment. Non-emergency , line transfers does take coordination with ATT which are in the process of addressing
- EFD: We've added the Emergency Fire Dispatch Protocol which is in the beginning phases of implantation
- Med Protocol 41: With this addition we've added training for the Medical Control Protocol 41: " Caller in Crisis" protocol
- This is for first party callers ONLY and deals with callers struggling with suicidal thoughts, self-injurious behavior, and other mental health crises. Protocol 25 deals with first party callers threatening suicide as well as second and third party callers dealing with another subject who is suicidal or having a mental health crisis.

- Received a new ambulance to replace the damaged one. Two other ambulances are out for warranty work

- New stair chair with power to it that allows the chair to go upstairs. Holds up to 500 pounds.
 - Next Month undergoing annual Reaccreditation with CAS which is the Commission on Accreditation of Ambulance Services.

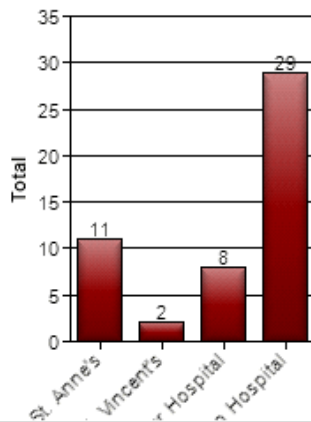

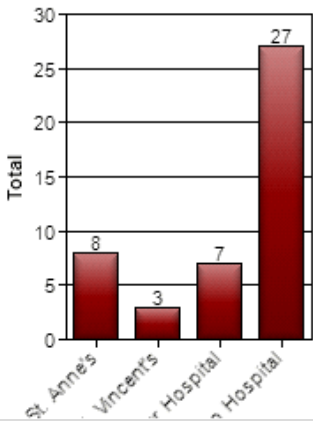
