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### 9. Citizens Time:

- R.J. Schall, President of County Fire Association stated silencing radio alerts in Monroe's dispatch center would not interfere with the consoles in any other dispatch center. R.J also agreed with the API for Active 911. He stated there are 28,000 fire departments in the United States and other countries that use Active 911. He stated they might have comments as well. R.J. stated they have been hammering to the fire departments that paging is primary. R.J. also stated it is not always an email issue, it is the individual's cell phone service that can contribute to a delay as well.
- Frenchtown Fire Chief Wendy Stevens asked IT Director Jake Perry if he needs CAD User Agreements from their individual IT companies. Director Perry stated they would need Vendor Agreements.
